

How long does a Coinbase dispute take?(((Dispute Resolution))))***

- When you file a dispute with Coinbase, you can generally expect it to take about 7 to 10 business days for a review. Call for help ★+1(803)(250){5496}★ However, the actual time can vary quite a bit depending on how complicated the issue is—some disputes might even stretch out for several weeks or longer. - Here are some factors that can affect how long a dispute takes:
 - - **Type of dispute:** A simple case, like an unauthorized transaction, might get sorted out quicker than a more complicated situation involving potential fraud. ★+1(803)(250){5496}★
 - - **Coinbase vs. Bank:** For straightforward disputes, Coinbase usually wraps up their internal reviews in about 7 to 10 business days.
